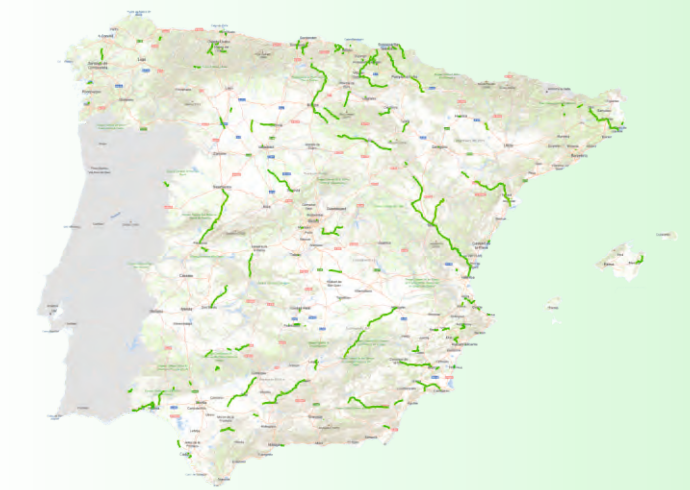




The Andalusian Greenways Network is made up of 25 itineraries, with a total a length of more than 800 km. The construction, maintenance and promotion of these infrastructures is the result of the investment by the Central Administration, the Regional Government of Andalusia and local administrations. Further development of new Greenways is also being promoted over nearly 1,000 km of disused railway lines in Andalusia.

There are currently 3,600 km of Greenways in Spain, distributed in 140 itineraries throughout the country. They are the result of initiatives taken within the framework of the Greenways Programme, which has been coordinated and promoted by the Spanish Railways Foundation since 1993, with the active collaboration of successive Ministries and other public administrations with responsibilities for the tourism, environment and rural development.

The Greenways are **old disused railway lines converted into ecotourism itineraries for travel without the use of motor vehicles** but rather: on foot, by bicycle, skates, wheelchairs, baby pushchairs, etc.

The use of Greenways is ideal for promoting sustainable mobility and exercise out in the open air in nature. It also helps to stimulate the economy in the nearby towns and to create employment at a local level.

These infrastructures are ideal for the practice of active and sustainable tourism, and they help to promote non-polluting mobility and healthy habits among citizens. Thanks to their origin as railway lines, Greenways provide maximum accessibility and are easy to use, as they require very little physical effort and are ideal for all types of users, including people with reduced mobility (children, the elderly, people with functional diversity, etc.). The routes are really safe as they do not allow motor vehicle traffic and they are also very pretty as they usually pass through rural landscapes of great beauty.

Greenways are itineraries full of magic, dotted with impressive tunnels and spectacular viaducts along which trains used to run. Some of the Andalusian Greenways can be reached by train, and this is highly recommended so you can fully enjoy the journey and keep contamination to a minimum.

Many of the old stations have been restored and provide information services, accommodation, restaurants, bicycle rental, sale of local products, etc. Some have also been converted into interesting visitor centres that complement the tourist and cultural attraction of these historic routes. HUELVA

1 *CNVV DEL GUADIANA* **16,7 KM**

Follow the tracks of a mining railroad through the hills of the Western Andevalo, to Puerto de La Laja, on the riverbanks of the Guadiana.

 El Almendro y El Granado



2 *VV DE THARSIS-ODIEL* **30 KM**

A circular route through the Marismas del Odiel Natural Park from the monumental railway docks of Tharsis in Huelva.

3 *VV DE MOLINOS DEL AGUA* **33 KM**

A route through an old mining railway from the countryside to the Serrania de Huelva, starting from the active station of San Juan del Puerto.

4 *VV DE RIO TINTO* **5,8 KM**

This is an old mining railroad route on the banks of the impressive Tinto River, between the old stations of Los Frailes and Berrocal.

CÁDIZ

5 *CNVV DE ENTRE RIOS* **16.2 KM**

A route from Rota to Chipiona through sea air fields, next to Costa Ballena, which reaches Sanlucar de Barrameda via several pathways.

6 *VV DE MATAGORDA* **3,6 KM**

A route along marshes and pine forests, in the Metropolitan Park of Marismas de Los Toruños and La Algaída Pine Grove, close to El Puerto de Santa Maria and near the University of Cadiz. Accessible by train (Las Aletas/Universidad stations).

7 *VV PUERTO REAL-SAN FERNANDO* **8,2 KM**

A walk through the Natural Park of the Bay of Cadiz, parallel to the railroad, between the active stations of Puerto Real and San Fernando.

CÁDIZ - SEVILLA

8 *CNVV DE LA SIERRA* **36,5 KM**

A track where trains did not run, with spectacular tunnels, viaducts and old refurbished stations (now lodgings, restaurants, bike rentals, vulture spotting and stargazing facilities...).

 Olvera, Puerto Serrano (Cádiz), Coripe, Montellano, Pruna y El Coronil (Sevilla).



SEVILLA

9 *VV DE LAS LAGUNAS* **11 KM**

A walk through olive groves in the countryside, starting from the active station of Pedrera, via a railway bypass.

10 *VV DE ITÁLICA* **2,6 KM**

An old railway line from Isla de la Cartuja in Seville to Camas, towards the ruins of the Roman Empire.

11 *VV EL RONQUILLO* **9,2 KM**

A route along the shore of the Minilla dam, among pastures and holm oaks, from the old railroad station of El Ronquillo restaurant.

12 *VV SIERRA MORENA DE SEVILLA* **18,3 KM**

A route located in the Sierra Morena Natural Park of Seville, between the Cazalla-Constantina active railroad station and the Cerro del Hierro Natural Monument.

SEVILLA - CÓRDOBA

13 *CNVV DE LA CAMPIÑA* **91,9 KM**

A route that goes through the farmlands of Seville and Cordoba, within reach of the city of Cordoba by bicycle and accessible by train from Marchena and Cordoba, at both ends.

 Córdoba, Guadalcazar, La Rambla, La Carlota, Fuente Palmera (Córdoba), Écija, La Luisiana, Fuentes de Andalucía y Marchena (Sevilla)



CÓRDOBA

14 *CNVV GUADIATO Y LOS PEDROCHES* **11,5 KM**
(Fuente Obejuna)

'Fuenteovejuna, todos a una'. All together, walking through Roman and mining vestiges along a section of the Greenway that will soon link Extremadura to Andalusia.

15 *VV DEL CERCO* **3,2 KM**

A walking tour among the ruins of the Cerco de Peñarroya-Pueblonuevo, one of the most important industrial heritage sites in Spain.

16 *CNVV GUADIATO Y LOS PEDROCHES* **42 KM**

A landscape to discover through the north of the province of Cordoba, with impressive mining railway remains and old stations refurbished for tourist use.

CÓRDOBA - JAÉN

17 *VV DEL ACEITE* **128 KM**

The longest Greenway in Andalusia. It runs through endless farmlands and olive groves, rugged mountains and whitewashed villages through the provinces of Jaen and Cordoba. Accessible by train from the city of Jaen and near the active station of Puente Genil-Herrera.

 Jaén, Torre del Campo, Torredonjimeno, Martos, Alcaudete (Jaén), Luque, Baena, Zuheros, Doña Mencía, Cabra, Lucena, Moriles, Aguilar de la Frontera y Puente Genil (Córdoba).



JAÉN

18 *VV DE LINARES* **6,6 KM**

A winding descent from the town of Linares to the Guadalimar river, near the active Linares-Baeza railway station.

 Linares



19 *CNVV RENACIMIENTO (Guadalimar)* **15,3 KM**

A route from the gallery forest of the Guadalimar river to the olive groves of the Guadalquivir riverside. Accessible by train from the active Linares-Baeza railway station.

JAÉN - ALBACETE

20 *CNVV RENACIMIENTO (Segura)* **73,5 KM**

A route among never ending olive groves and the Natural Park of Sierras de Cazorla, Segura and Las Villas, which joins the provinces of Jaen and Albacete, along the old railroad Baeza-Utiel, where the train never passed.

 Villanueva del Arzobispo, Sorihuela del Guadalimar, Beas de Segura, Arroyo del Ojanco, Segura de la Sierra, Puente de Génave, La Puerta de Segura, Génave y Villarrodrigo



MÁLAGA

21 *VV DEL RINCÓN DE LA VICTORIA* **8 KM**

A seaside promenade among tunnels and trenches, which follows the tracks of a narrow-gauge railroad.

GRANADA

22 *VV DE SIERRA NEVADA* **1,7 KM**

On the banks of the Genil river, a route of an old tramway that passes by the old Maitena Station and gives access to the Sierra Nevada National Park.

GRANADA - ALMERÍA

23 *CNVV FC GUADIX-ALMENDRICOS* **98,7 KM**
(Baza-Valle del Almanzora)

A route connecting the provinces of Granada and Almeria through a steppe landscape in the surroundings of the Sierra de Baza Natural Park.

 Freila, Zújar, Baza y Caniles (Granada), Alcóntar, Serón, Tijola, Armuña de Almanzora, Purchena, Olula del Río, Fines, Cantoria, y Arboleas (Almería).



ALMERÍA - MURCIA

24 *CNVV FC GUADIX-ALMENDRICOS* **20 KM**
(Huércal-Overa)

A route along a stretch with Mediterranean vegetation on white chalk lands, going from Almeria into the region of Murcia.

ALMERÍA

25 *VV LUCAINENA DE LAS TORRES* **15,5 KM**

A route in the shade of the Sierra de Alhamilla through the old mining railroad that reached the Agua Amarga mineral loading dock.
